## Cricket battles at Lords and Hulftsdorp

While Sri Lanka was battling with England at cricket's headquarters Lords, vesterday, the tussle over the recent election to the Board of Control for Cricket figured at Hulftsdorp and chances of an amicable set-

tlement to the dispute seemed to fade. This was indicated when the case against the Board of Control for Cricket in Sri Lanka (BCCSL) came up for hearing before Colombo

District Judge A. W. Salam yesterday. On the last date, Court appealed to both parties to consider resolving the issue amicably in the larger interest of cricket and the

country at large. Counsel for both parties gave an undertaking to Court to explore the avenues for a settlement. But vesterday their submissions indicated that their clients were unable to

arrive at a negotiated settlement. In this case plaintiff Clifford Ratwatte has filed a suit through his counsel G. G. Arulpragasam challenging the propriety of the recent election to office bearers of the

defendant Cricket Board. Paul Ratnayake Associates filed the

answers of the defendants. S. L. Gunasekera, counsel for the defenclients that the election of office bearers was fair and free. In view of such a standpoint as opposed to the view of the plaintiff, it is unlikely to reach a settlement.
